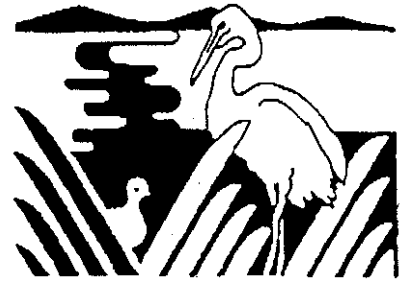
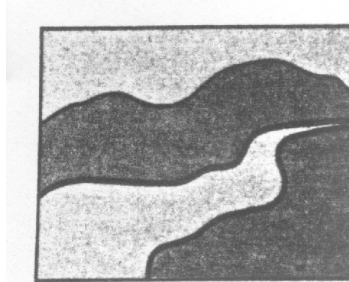


What's the difference?
